

ACTA AWARDS AND CRITERIA

The ACTA Cup Award

This perpetual cup is ACTA's special friend of tennis award. It is presented to the person or persons who have made an individual/group contribution toward growing and promoting tennis in our community and surrounding areas.

Adult Female and Male Player of the Year

This award is given to the person who holds a state, sectional, or national ranking, participates in tournament level tennis, achieves an excellent win/loss record during the league year, displays high levels of cooperation and unusually good sportsmanship throughout the league year, exhibits good practice ethics and possesses a team spirit beyond expectations.

Adult Female and Male League Player of the Year

This award is given to the person who regularly participates in league tennis, achieves an excellent win/loss record during the league year, displays high levels of cooperation and unusually good sportsmanship throughout the league year, shows good practice ethics and possesses a team spirit beyond expectations.

Junior Female and Male Player of the Year

This award is given to the junior who participates in tournament level tennis, holds a state, sectional or national ranking, participates in local tennis programs, demonstrates good sportsmanship and participates in service projects, thereby demonstrating a willingness to give back to the sport that has given her or him so much.

Junior Female and Male League Player of the Year

This award is given to the junior who regularly participates in league tennis, achieves an excellent win/loss record during the league year, displays high levels of cooperation and unusually good sportsmanship throughout the league year, shows good practice ethics and possesses a team spirit beyond expectations.

Female and Male Captain of the Year

This award is presented to the captain who has been a captain during two seasons in the year under consideration (i.e. fall, winter, spring or summer), has displayed exemplary leadership ability, has great enthusiasm for tennis, has good organizational skills, has served as a good role model for sportsmanship and has shown a dedication to achieving the goals of ACTA.

Volunteer of the Year

This award is presented to the person who exemplifies an unselfish attitude with her or his personal commitment to ACTA by promoting tennis in our community through exemplary volunteer efforts.

Family of the Year

This award is presented to the family who in recent years has done the most to promote amateur tennis, primarily on a volunteer basis. All members of the family should participate in some way, either as players or by offering their services in running programs, tournaments or junior development.

Official of the Year

This award is presented to a USTA certified tennis official who has made outstanding contributions to the cause of tennis officiating.
